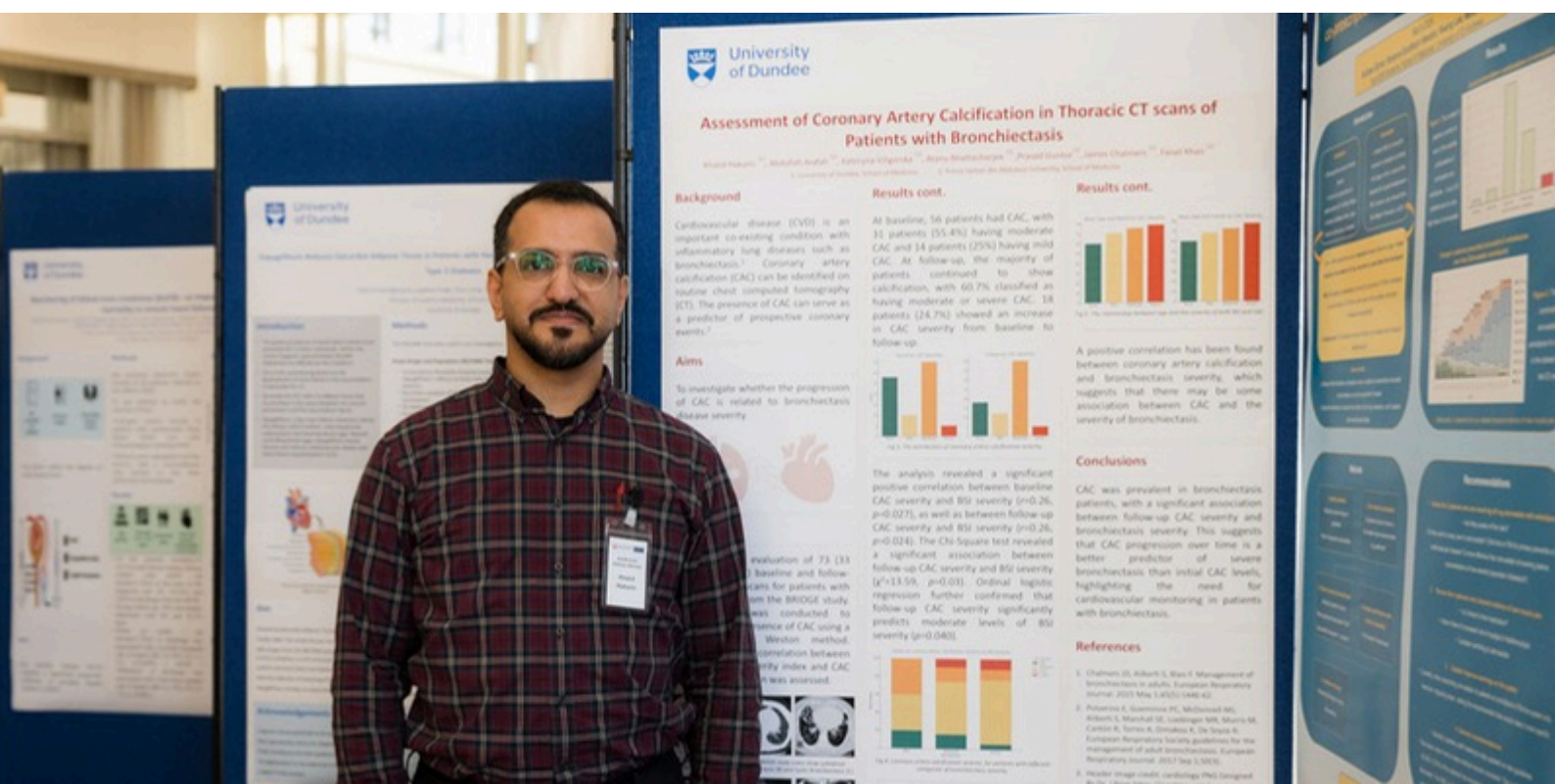
GENERAL INFORMATION

YOUR STEP BY STEP GUIDE

GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSIONS

- Abstracts should be no more than 250 words (excluding title, figures, tables, and references).
- You may submit more than one abstract, providing all work is distinct from each other.
- You must submit your abstract using the 2026 SHARP Prize Abstract Submission online form.
- The deadline for abstract submissions is 20th September 2026 at 23:59 (UK time).
- If you want to withdraw an abstract, please contact admin@sharpscotland.org by the submission deadline.



TERMS & CONDITIONS

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION TERMS & CONDITIONS

- The SHARP Prize is open to SHARP members only. To become a member, visit: <https://www.sharpscotland.org/membership>.
- All correspondence relating to the abstract will be sent to the presenting author only.
- You must confirm that you have permission from all authors to submit your Abstract.
- In submitting an abstract you confirm that the presenting author, will attend the conference.
- Any changes to the presenter or any other contact details must be communicated directly to SHARP at admin@sharpscotland.org.



SELECTION & PREPARATION

HOW ARE ABSTRACTS SELECTED?

Abstracts are reviewed and shortlisted by the SHARP Executive Committee, who will assess whether the proposed paper fits the scope of the conference.

REGISTRATION FOR THE CONFERENCE

When submissions are accepted, all participants must confirm their involvement by email and register for the conference. A registration link will be included in your acceptance email.

Presenting authors of oral presentations will receive complimentary registration and overnight accommodation for the two-day conference, including attendance at the drinks reception and conference dinner on Thursday evening.

Presenting authors of poster presentations will receive complimentary day registration for both days of the conference.

POSTER PRESENTERS

- Poster presenters must supply a printed poster for display at the conference.
- Posters must be A0 size and portrait orientation. We cannot accommodate posters larger than A0.
- Please bring your printed poster with you on the day for display.
- Please submit a PDF copy of your poster by 25 October 2026, 23:59 (UK time) to admin@sharpscotland.org. Please name your file SHARP2026-YourLastName.pdf.

ORAL PRESENTERS

- In addition to the poster requirements, oral presenters must submit a copy of their PowerPoint presentation by 1 November 2026, 23:59 (UK time) to admin@sharpscotland.org. Please name your file SHARP2026-YourLastName.pptx.
- Please bring your presentation on a USB as a backup.
- You will have the opportunity to meet the technician before your session.

POSTER GUIDELINES

1. GENERAL FORMAT:

- Size & Orientation: A0 size and in portrait orientation. We cannot display posters larger than A0.

2. CONTENT:

- Title: Include a concise and descriptive title at the top. Use a large, bold font (at least 72 pt).
- Organise content into distinct sections: Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion, and Conclusion.
- Use clear headings (24-36 pt) to define each section.

3. VISUALS:

- Images and Graphs: Use high-quality images and ensure they are clearly labelled. Graphics should be easy to read from a distance.
- Colour Scheme: Use a professional colour scheme that enhances readability. Avoid overly bright or clashing colours.
- Fonts: Use sans-serif fonts for readability (e.g., Arial, Helvetica). Keep font sizes consistent; typically, body text should be 24-36 pt.
- SHARP Logo: The official SHARP logo must be included on the poster. Please ensure the logo is high resolution and not altered or distorted.



POSTER GUIDELINES

4. LAYOUT:

- Flow: Arrange content in a logical flow that guides viewers from the title to the conclusions.
- Sections: Use clear headings and subheadings to separate sections.
- White Space: Include white space as appropriate to avoid clutter and make the poster easier to read.

5. PRESENTATION:

- Practice: Be prepared to present your poster and discuss your research with attendees. Practice a brief summary (1-2 minutes) of your work.
- Engagement: Encourage questions and discussions from viewers. Be open to feedback.

6. PRINTING AND DISPLAY

- You are required to supply a printed poster for display at the conference.
- Posters must be A0 size and portrait orientation. We cannot accommodate posters larger than A0.
- Please bring your poster with you on the day and use the provided display materials for affixing your poster.
- Please remove your poster at the end of the conference.
